A reading from the letter of Paul to the Colossians.

#### **Gospel Reading**

#### John 1.1-14

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. **Glory to you, O Lord.** 

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

The Wells Foodbank and Furniture Storehouse Project is now a separate entity and no longer associated with the Wells Vineyard Church. The work of the Foodbank will continue as usual from its site in Rowdens Road.

This link is currently on the Vineyard Church website, but is specific to the Foodbank and will move to a new Foodbank website in March. More details will be available in the following weeks. Your donations are vital. The Foodbank spends around £2000 per month on groceries to meet the growing need.

In addition to the regular items listed, the Foodbank is particularly short of: 2 in 1 shampoos. Chocolate spread is particularly appreciated by the children.

Regular items: Tinned meals, eg stewed steak, chicken in white sauce, sausages and beans, Bolognese, Tinned ham, corned beef.

Tea, coffee, alternative milks. Instant meal pots and kits, eg curry, stir fry & Mexican meals. Toiletries eg toothpaste, shampoo and shower gels. Washing pods & cleaning products

There are sufficient stocks of baked beans.

**PLEASE CHECK** the sell-by date of donations from your larder, as the Foodbank cannot accept any out-of-date food.

If you wish to donate food directly in the supermarkets, and want them to be used locally, please ensure the collection point is for the Wells Foodbank. Otherwise, please leave items in the box by the door in St Thomas.
